Dear Mr. Deutsch:

It was a pleasure to have met you last Monday at the Center's birthday tribute to William Kunstler. I thank you for your kind offer to review the Article 78 proceeding, Sassower v. Mangano, et al. now pending before the New York State Court of Appeals on a motion for reagument of its dismissal of our appeal as of right and, alternatively, for leave to appeal.

Enclosed is that motion, <u>returnable August 1, 1994</u>, and our two original submissions to the Court of Appeals, which I sent to Mr. Kunstler under a May 25, 1994 coverletter.

That coverletter, outlining the mind-boggling constitutional issues invovled in this case, is enclosed, as is the letter I sent to Mr. Kunstler's office following our conversation last Monday.

We <u>urgently</u> need organizational support before the Court of Appeals and <u>immediate</u> legal assistance in preparing a petition for a writ of certiorari to the U.S. Supreme Court, which we believe must be filed by <u>August 14, 1994</u>.

In addition, we require organizational and legal backing for a federal action under 42 U.S.C. §1983 based upon the deliberate deprivation of my mother's due process and equal protection rights. We believe such federal action should also seek a declaration that Judiciary Law §90 and the Appellate Division rules are unconstitutional. For discussion of that subject, I refer you to pp. 16-23 of the reargument motion.

In that connection, I enclose the case of Mildner v. Gulotta, 405 F.Supp 182 (1975) which I briefly described to you on Monday evening -- referred to at ¶¶42-4 of the reargument motion.

Please let us hear from you soon.
