LECTURE REPORT

On Tuesday evening, Feb. 9th, Miss Leila Morgan of the Williamsburg and Greenpoint Health Center, spoke on "Health Needs of the Community."

Miss Morgan stated that it was wise to take a chest X-Ray once a year. This service is given at the Health Center, 151 Maujer St. In this manner infectious diseases can be detected and treated, thus safeguarding the other members of the community and saving the patient who is unaware of his danger.

The Cencer Detection Clinic is also located at the Health Center. Laboratory and physical tests are given free to the people of Brooklyn who are 30 years of age or over. It is for well people. If, during the examination, anything should be found wrong, in its early stages it may be corrected. Thus, it will save time, money, mental anguish, and even life itself. Therefore, the people of Williamsburg should take advantage of the services in their midst.

A Mental Health Clinic has also been opened at the Health Center. It is available to the people of the community who are 15 years of age and over.

A vote of thanks to Miss Morgan for bringing to our attention the advantages we have in this neighborhood so that we can enjoy better health and longer life. "Life can be beautiful."
