Judicial Misconduct Complaint

BRUCE W. KAUFMAN

1. In my motion of April 17, 2009 (*Geo. Sassower v. Sisk*, ED Pas., 91 Civ 4047), I requested, *inter alia*:

“(2) directing that *Citibank, N.A.*, pay the filing fees due this Court and/or the .. *United States*, crediting *Citibank, N.A.* for such payment by the monies it owes the plaintiff ....”

In his Order-Decision of the 18<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2009, U.S. District Court Judge *Bruce W. Kaufman* ignored such relief, thus depriving the federal government of fees rightfully due it, since such filing was made without the payment of fees.

Exclusive control of the federal purse is with Congress, not the judiciary, and members of the judiciary do not have the constitutional “power” to waive fees due where otherwise available, certainly not for “*bribes*” paid by *Citibank, N.A.*, which was the obvious motivating factor of U.S. District Court Judge *Bruce W. Kaufman*.

2. In his Order-Decision of the 18<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2009, U.S. District Court Judge *Bruce W. Kaufman* stated that in my publication “The Rise and Fall of Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States Samuel A. Alito, Smoking Guns I & II in which he makes a number of series of *unsubstantiated* allegations .....” [emphasis supplied].

I will not wait for a decision by this Court, but expect that within two (2) weeks from this date, U.S. District Court Judge *Bruce W. Kaufman*, in a public document, with service on the undersigned, will set forth, with specific particulars, that “series of allegations”, which he found “*unsubstantiated*”.

4. Other objectionable material, I leave for the usual judicial process or reargument and review.
