



U.S. District Judge NICHOLAS H. POLITAN
28 U.S.C. §372(c)

This is the first, of what will be a series, of complaints against U.S. District Judge NICHOLAS H. POLITAN.

1. In manifest violation of Canon(A)(4) of the Code of Judicial Conduct, which was adopted by the Judicial Conference of the United States (Report of Judicial Conference of the U.S. [1973] p. 9-11, 52; [1974] p. 17), Judge Politan engaged himself in many ex parte communications, with various persons, some of whom were inextricably involved in egregious criminal conduct, none of which conversations Judge Politan voluntarily revealed to the undersigned, and all such conversations motivated his conduct, judicial and otherwise.

The end result of these ex parte conversations was to advance a criminal racketeering adventure involving the larceny and plundering of judicial trust assets.

Of particular importance to Judge Politan and his co-conspirators to maintain uninterrupted the flow of extortion monies from HYMAN RAFFE to CLAPP & EISENBERG, P.C.

As independently and reported by Mr. Jonathan Ferziger of United Press International (Village Voice, June 6, 1988):

"Sassower was found guilty of 63 counts of contempt of court. ... Raffé ... was also faced with 71 counts of criminal contempt. By signing three extraordinary agreements in 1985, however, Raffé agreed to foot all legal costs incurred by Feltman's firm and Citibank's lawyers, Kreindler & Relkin, for defending against Sassower. In exchange, the court agreed to let him go free. The tab so far has come to more than \$2.5 million, paid to both the Feltman and Kreindler firms [the clients of Clapp & Eisenberg]. Raffé continues to pay with checks from his A.R. Fuels Co. business. 'That's outrageous. It's unbelievable. It's disturbing. ...' Said Attorney General Abrams when he saw copies of the checks. Abrams is the statutory watchdog over court-appointed receivers like Feltman."

Thus, my initial complaint and the concomitant obligation of Judge Politan, even at this last date, is for a full and complete disclosure of all the ex parte conversations by and on behalf of Judge Politan.

2. To insure the flow of extortion monies, Judge Politan operated in concert with Chief U.S. Judge CHARLES L. BRIEANT of the Southern District of New York, who is an active member of this criminal racketeering adventure.


Such coordinated operation with Judge Brieant reach a manifestly unconstitutional and depraved level when Judge Brieant issued a ukase that the undersigned was physically barred from the Federal Building and Courthouse in White Plains, N.Y., unless he receives the permission of Judge Brieant or Judge Politan.

3. One of the aforementioned ex parte conversations, initiated by Judge Politan, was with U.S. Magistrate NINA GERSHON of New York, which included the remark by Judge Politan that "I will teach Sassower a lesson".

The tenor of this entire conversation with Magistrate Gershon, was a Judge Politan "direction" to Magistrate Gershon that I was to be held "without bail".

4. A federal district judge who clearly and knowingly usurps the limited authority of his office by refusing to permit the undersigned to file a notice of appeal from an "interlocutory injunction" which, even if not appealable, is the province of the circuit judge, not a district judge, and such judge must be disciplined, if not removed from judicial office.
