I acknowledge receipt of the Petition for Review of your
judicial complaints. It has been forwarded to the Fourth Circuit
Judicial Council for action.


These four complaints were sent to Chief Judge Ervin on March
26, 1991. Rule 3(a)(2) of the Rules of the Judicial Council of the
Fourth Circuit Governing Complaints of Judicial Misconduct and
Disability requires that a copy of a complaint be sent to the judge
complained about and to the chief judge of that district. If the
chief judge is complained about, then a copy of the complaint is
sent to the most senior judge in that district. In 91-9010, the
complaint was against Chief Judge Black and a copy of the complaint
was sent to Judge Howard.

Your fifth complaint, 91-9011, which was against Chief Judge
Ervin, was sent to Judge Donald Russell for disposition. That
complaint is still pending.

I am returning the copies of your informal brief in 91-9129,
Sassower v. Ervin. This court has no record of an appeal with that
case number. Do you intend to file this brief in case number 91-
2547 or 91-2622? If so, please label it correctly and return it.
