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A Professional Disciplinary Complaint, dated May 3, 2012, having been filed with the Committee on Professional Standards against **FREDERICK J. SCULLIN, JR.**, for his misconduct as a United States Attorney for the Northern District of New York, and the Committee on Professional Standards, on May 8, 2012, *sua sponte*, having referred such complaint to the Attorney Grievance Committee for the Fifth Judicial District, and it

APPEARS, that the misconduct, as described, such as defrauding his client, the United States, financially & otherwise, as more fully appears in said complaint which, in every respect was *undenied & uncontroverted*, by FREDERICK J. SCULLIN, JR. and every one else aware of the proceedings; and it further

APPEARS, at no time, even during the pendency of this proceeding, the said FREDERICK J. SCULLIN, JR. has made any attempt to remedy the injury caused by his misconduct, such as to reimburse the United States for the unauthorized federal expenditures made by him; it is

ORDERED that the said **FREDERICK J. SCULLIN, JR.** be and is disbarred as an attorney, effective thirty (30) days from the date of this Order; and it is further

ORDERED that a copy of this Order shall be served on the Public Integrity Section of the Department of Justice in order to obtain "*reimbursement*" in favor of the United States for the *unauthorized* monies & services expended and/or for any other reason.
