Gentlemen:

My complaint about the above attorney is summarized in my letters to the United States Trustee, dated June 18, 1987 and the one of even date, copies of which are enclosed.

From your and the professional point of view, the unanswered question is why has the above attorney, as a trustee, failed and refused to take any steps to collect the indebtedness due my estate from the firm of Feltman, Karesh, Major & Farbman, Esqs., or anyone of their co-conspirators?

It does not matter whether Mr. Sapir represents all my creditors in a Chapter 7, or essentially me, in a Chapter 13, he is still a fiduciary, with fiduciary obligations, which includes the obligation to collect.

The bottom line is why has Mr. Sapir refused to collect my judgment and claims, or cooperate in their collection, when his fee would have been substantial?

As Mr. Sapir is aware, Feltman, Karesh, Major & Farbman, Esqs. and their co-conspirators, especially at Kreindler & Relkin, P.C., have been engaged in the larceny of judicial trust assets, perjury, extortion, blackmail, and official and judicial corruption, and my contention is that they have also corrupted Mr. Sapir, a contention that Mr. Sapir's actions tend to confirm.
