APPEARS, that the misconduct described, such as defrauding his client, the United States, financially & otherwise, as more fully appears in said complaint which, in every respect was *undenied & uncontroverted*, by FREDERICK J. SCULLIN, JR. and every one else aware of the proceedings; and it further

APPEARS, to conceal such misconduct by FREDERICK J. SCULLIN, JR. and leave his victims, including the United States, remediless, the said **GREGORY J HUETHER**, Esq. and **ANTHONY J. GIGLIOTTI**, Esq. had a lay person, SHERYL M. CRANKSHAW, who was not subject to professional discipline, and had no such authority, falsely state that the complaint “fails” to describe any misconduct which would constitute a violation of the Code of Professional Responsibility; it is

ORDERED that the said **GREGORY J HUETHER**, Esq. and **ANTHONY J. GIGLIOTTI**, Esq. by July 17, 2012, justify their actions or be discharged as employees and/or appointees of the Attorney Grievance Committee, and made the subject of Professional Disciplinary Proceedings.
