Honorable Sir:

1a. The legislative mandate to Robert Abrams, the Attorney General of the State of New York, the state's highest law officer, is that if a receiver does not render an accounting within eighteen (18) months, his "duty" is to make application for such accounting (Bus. Corp. Law §1216[a]).

b. The Attorney General has discretion in seeking various remedies pursuant to Bus. Corp. Law §1214[a], but after eighteen (18) months his application for an accounting is mandated as a "duty" under §1216[a].

2a. By Order of the Supreme Court, New York County, PUCCINI CLOTHES, LTD. was involuntarily dissolved on June 4, 1980 -- more than eight (8) years ago -- more than four (4) times the maximum period of eighteen (18) months, and Robert Abrams has never made application for such accounting, although many demands have been made that he fulfill the mandated legislative "duty" of his office in this respect.

b. Puccini's judicial trust assets unquestionably were made the subject of massive larceny by those who have the "inside track" with Abrams and others, and consequently no accounting can be rendered without exposing the criminal activity involved.

3a. What moral right does the legislature have to enact laws when the Attorney General himself refuses to obey them in order to aid and abet his cronies in a criminal adventure?

c. You will find that there are no accountings!
