Honorable Sir:

- In addition to the material mailed to Your Excellency dated August 15, 1988, yesterday's review of the County Clerk's file in New York County reveals that no Business Corporation Law §1207 Statement, which must be filed on or before February 1 of each year, has been filed by Lee Feltman, Esq., the court-appointed receiver for Puccini Clothes, Ltd., or by anyone else, in 1987 or 1988.
- b. By law, a copy of such filing <u>must</u> also be served upon the Attorney General, and consequently he and his office are aware of this mandated omission.
- 2. The Attorney General and Mr. Morganthau know that such verified §1207 Statement for Puccini Clothes, Ltd. can never be properly and truthfully filed, since the mandatory listing of "assets" would reveal the massive larceny of judicial trust assets which took place. Neither the Attorney General nor Mr. Morganthau, as part of a corrupt racketeering conspiracy, will prosecute or bring this matter to the attention of the grand jury.
- 3. If Your Excellency would simply request the files of the Attorney General, Mr. Morganthau, the Office of Court Administration, and Administrative Judge Xavier C. Riccobono, with respect to this judicial receivership, you will find a corrupt racketeering enterprise in existence (Penal Law Article 460), with respect to Puccini and other similarly situated judicial trusts.
- In this state, Mr. Governor, the question is Quis Custodiet Ipsos Custodes?
