An Open Letter

Dear Congresswoman Lowey,

I am certain I speak for the vox populi when I request that you unequivocally speak against governmental waste, corruption and despotism, and firmly and decisively act thereon. Consequently, I respectfully request, as a priority measure, by words and action, the following:

1. Recovery of penalty monies made payable, in haec verba, "to the [federal] court", but diverted instead to private pockets.
2. Recovery of monies due, as a matter of law, to the "sovereign", federal, state and local, but diverted instead to private pockets.
3. Recovery of monies expended by the "sovereign", federal, state and local, including for repeated trialess convictions, to serve a private racketeering purposes.
4. Recovery of unpaid tax monies due the "sovereign", federal, state and local, resulting from the massive larceny of judicial trust assets to serve private pockets.
5. Recovery of monies paid by the "sovereign", federal and state, for the unlawful practice of "disguised judicial nepotism".
6. Recovery of monies expended by the "sovereign", federal, state, and local, for the incarceration of Mr. Dennis F. Vilella convicted of 'phantom' crimes, motivated by unlawful and depraved purposes.
7. Investigation of judicial and prosecutorial misconduct, including trialess, manifestly unconstitutional convictions for non-summary criminal contempt.

James Buchanan, as Chairman of the House Judiciary Committee, thereafter the 15th President of the U.S., promised the nation, in causing the enactment of the Act of March 2, 1831, that Luke Lawless, Esq., was to be "the last victim". I expect Congress, by its action, to give vitality to such promise.

Trialess convictions and incarcerations do not occur in any part of the civilized world, and certainly should not occur in the New York area.
