Dear Reporter:

I am the daughter of George Sassower, who is featured in the attached story in the June 6th issue of <u>The Village Voice</u>. As you can see from the enclosed materials, the published story is the "tip" of an "iceberg" that will have significant judicial and political ramifications—if exposed.

At present, my father is incarcerated at the Metropolitan Correctional Center (MCC) under a <u>defective and improper</u> warrant of arrest and <u>denied</u> bail for the underlying misdemeanor--filing of a motion to enjoin <u>extortion</u> payments which now total over \$2,500,000.

This extortion is part of a <u>documented and documentable</u> story of what goes on with trusts, estates, and involuntarily-dissolved corporations whose assets fall into the custody of the Court. It is a story not about the corruption of one judge--but about a system of corruption. The corruption goes beyond the courts--and is made possible by the direct criminal complicity of the office of the Attorney General--and a panoply of other governmental agencies.

This is a sensational story—and a significant one. The People of New York have a right to know what goes on within the judicial and political system. They have a right to know that regulations and statutes, whose very purpose is to prevent unlawful aggrandizement on the part of the Court and its appointees, "look good on paper", but are not given obedience by the Courts, nor by the appropriate government agencies.

And the People should know that "it <u>can</u> and <u>does</u> happen here"-that in this country, (in the heart of New York, no less) there
are criminal convictions and incarcerations <u>without</u> the
constitutional guarantee of trial--and that agreements are
criminally <u>extorted</u> whereby monies are paid to private pockets.

This horror story can be <u>fully</u> documented—and we ask only that you give us that opportunity and investigate the truth. At a time when every newspaper reports about jail overcrowding and the release pending trial of would—be cop—killers, George Sassower is <u>denied</u> bail for a misdemeanor and, notwithstanding recent surgery and a doctor's affidavit as to the state of his health, is incarcerated——"a prisoner of the courts and the judges who rule them" (<u>Village Voice</u>). I believe the Media has some questions to ask about this situation.
