

Re: Sassower v. Crites and Barr

Honorable Sir:

Enclosed find a copy of my stay application in the above matter which, by itself, reveals that the judicial corruption in the Second Circuit has enveloped the Sixth Circuit.

Defense representation, at federal cost and expense, without a 28 U.S.C. 2679[d] "scope" certification, of federal judges involved in the diversion of monies payable "to the federal court" to private pockets is, to say the least, a criminal scandal of vertiginous heights, made more egregious by the failure of the Attorney General to support my applications to recapture such diverted monies in favor of the United States.

Because I choose to oppose and expose criminal activity, with its judicial involvement, my substantial, contractually based, assets have been effectively "frozen" by the New York-Second Circuit judiciary, relegating me to in forma pauperis applications, thus further depriving the federal treasury of monies rightfully due it.
