PETITION FOR A WRIT OF CERTIORARI TO THE CIRCUIT COURT OF APPEALS FOR THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA PETITIONER'S MOTION

Petitioner respectfully moves this Court: (a) to compel the respondent, U.S. Attorney General JANET RENO ["Reno"] and/or the U.S. Solicitor General DREW S. DAYS, III ["Days"], to make demand or take such other action as may be necessary to compel KREINDLER & RELKIN, P.C. ["K&R"], CITIBANK, N.A. ["Citibank"], and/or FELTMAN, KARESH, MAJOR & FARBMAN, Esqs. ["FKM&F"] to pay to the Clerk of this Court the necessary fees in order to satisfy petitioner's monetary filing obligations to this Court, and permitting K&R, Citibank, and/or FKM&F to debit their obligations to petitioner under his contractually based, constitutionally protected money judgment against PUCCINI

CLOTHES, LTD. ["Puccini"] (Exhibit "A" - see Sassower v. Puccini, Docket No. 93-5128); (b) removing this Petition from the in forma pauperis calendar and striking all false references in this Court, express or implied, which asserts that petitioner is a pauper, when in fact he is of substantial wealth; (c) directing the respondent, U.S. Attorney General Reno and/or U.S. Solicitor Days, to take such action as may be necessary to recover the substantial monies, which include monies paid on behalf of petitioner which, by court-order, were payable "to the federal court", but diverted to K&R and Citibank; (d) for leave to file an Amended Petition, which will conform to the printing requirements of this Court for non-in forma pauperis petitioners, which Amended Petition will contain additional, relevant, if not decisive, facts and assertions which, to protect confidential sources, could not be previously disclosed; (e) together with such other relief as to this Court may seem just and proper in the premises.

- la. Solicitor General Days, if he truly represents "the government", as distinguished from rogue jurists and officials, should support this motion "with zeal", since it inures to the monetary benefit of "the government".
- b. Solicitor General Days, is an Article II member of government, and where Article III jurists are defrauding the governmental purse, his constitutional and professional obligations are crystal clear. Solicitor General Days should not, as he has, be permitted to "waive a response", unless requested by this Article III Court.

- 2a. Petitioner, although receiving "food stamp" assistance, is a person of substantial wealth, but because he will not involve himself in judicial corruption, or "pay-off" judges and officials, which are the "coins of the judicial realm" in New York and the Second Circuit, nor abdicate his professional and social responsibilities, is denied access to the courts, state and federal, by transparently invalid injunctions, except by permission, invariably denied.
- b. Thus petitioner is denied his right to petition the state and federal courts for, e.g., writs of habeas corpus, for coram nobis (see <u>Sassower v. K&R</u>, Docket No. 93-3682), and Rule 60(b)[4][6] relief, even under compelling circumstances.
- and federal, to liquidate his contractually based assets, even when not Puccini related, and where the debtor is judicially estopped from denying that at least \$120,000, plus interest, is due him (see Sassower v. A.R., Docket No. 93-5129).
- d. The aforementioned, and much more, is fully documented in this Court, as well as in other courts, as is the fact that petitioner's adversaries are "paying-off" state and federal judges.
- The Article III constitutional mandate for access to the federal courts extends to "all" cases or controversies involving federal issues, and judicial despots, such as Chief U.S. Circuit Court Judge JON O. NEWMAN ["Newman"] of the Second Circuit, cannot legislate otherwise, simply because petitioner chooses to resist and expose judicial racketeering activities.

b. Nevertheless, there is no legitimate reason why this Court and/or the federal government should be deprived of monies rightfully due them because of petitioner's peccadillos, whatever they may be.

c. Petitioner is <u>not</u> requesting any direct monetary relief for himself, including for the cost of printing a proper petition and appendix, only such financial relief as is due this Court and/or "the government" which, to repeat, the attorney for "the government", the Solicitor General, is professionally bound to support.

4a. Despite petitioner's substantial wealth, in order to gain access to this Court, petitioner must libel himself, by falsely declaring himself a pauper (Katapodis v. Brooklyn Spectator, 287 N.Y. 17, 38 N.E.2d 112, 137 ALR 910 [1941], anno. at p. 913).

b. That stigma is false, untrue, and needless, and petitioner requests that it be expunded, by removing this proceeding from the <u>in forma pauperis</u> calendar, whether or not the respondents and/or Solicitor General pursues petitioner's assets under the Uniform Fraudulent Claims Act.

WHEREFORE, it is respectfully prayed that this motion be granted in all respects.
