Petitioner moves this Court for a:

Mandatory stay/injunction to compel the U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit to provide petitioner with a forum where he can liquidate his contractually based, constitutionally protected, money judgment (Exhibit "A")-- which, with interest, now amount to about \$60,000 --- so that petitioner can, inter alia, (a) pay the filing fees due this, and other courts, and not proceed in forma pauperis; (b) pay for the printing and Xerox expenses for a proper presentation to this

Court for a Writ of Certiorari; and (c) terminate petitioner's government "food stamp" assistance and his semi-poverty existence.

- 1. This is one of three (3), interrelated and simultaneously submitted, applications for substantially the same relief, and which are marked by brevity.
- Petitioner has very substantial assets, including those of a contractual nature and constitutionally protected (Article 1 \$10[1], Amendment V of the <u>U.S. Constitution</u>), of which this judgment is only one.
- b. However, petitioner for refusing to involve himself, resisting, and exposing judicial racketeering activities, is denied access to the courts, state and federal, all by non-due process edicts, except by permission, invariable denied.
- 3a. Petitioner is an born American citizen and battle-starred veteran of World War II, who simply will not forfeit his First Amendment rights and societal responsibilities by any desired silence on the subject of judicial corruption.
- b. Petitioner has legitimate Article III, federal cases and controversies, and is entitled to a federal forum to vindicate same.
- Leave to appeal from a denial of leave to file and prosecute, was received by the Circuit Court on August 24, 1992, and denied nine (9) months later, on May 13, 1993 (Exhibit "B").

- b. An, inter alia, Rule 23.3 stay was received by the Circuit Court on August 24, 1992, and also denied nine (9) months later on May 14, 1993 (Exhibit "C").
- 5a. The transactional involvement of Associate Justice CLARENCE THOMAS appears on a simultaneously submitted application, and is not repeated herein.
- b. Recusal, at this point, is only requested on onejudge determinations.
- 6. The aforementioned is stated to be true under penalty of perjury.

WHEREFORE, it is respectfully prayed that this application be granted in all respects

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
