Illinois (391 U.S. 194) which holds that a person may be convicted, sentenced, and incarcerated for non-summary criminal contempt, absent a plea of guilty, without a trial?

b. If the response is in the affirmative, set forth that or those decisions or opinions.

2. Set forth any and all ex parte communications regarding the convictions of GEORGE SASSOWER, Esq., which are or may be proscribed by Canon 3 of the Code of Judicial Conduct, including to or from Hon. Xavier C. Riccobono, Hon. Ira Gammernan, and/or Referee Donald Diamond, or on their behalf.

3. Set forth any vindicating, exculpatory, or mitigating facts or circumstances regarding the aforesaid convictions, including the assertions made that (1) Lee Feltman, Esq. and Feltman, Karesh & Major, Esq., are conducting themselves contrary to the legitimate interests of Puccini Clothes, Ltd., their judicial trust; (2) Arutt, Nachamie, Benjamin, Lipkin & Kirschner, P.C., are acting contrary to the legitimate interests of their clients; (3) Senior Assistant Attorney General David S. Cook, Esq., is representing members of the judiciary and simultaneously the statutory representative of Puccini Clothes, Ltd; and (4) Kreindler & Relkin, P.C. engineered the unlawful dissipation of the assets of Puccini Clothes, Ltd., after June 4, 1980.
