CJA's webpage on our citizen opposition to the Halligan nomination has been updated to reflect new developments, including my yesterday's letter to Nan Aron of the Alliance for Justice -- & I had wanted to draw these to you attention, as well as to share with you important information that is not posted.

Please call me when you wish to discuss the status of Ms. Halligan's Senate confirmation, about which you showed such interest in your <u>ten</u> "benchmemo posts" since January 31<sup>st</sup>.

As I do not have any direct contact information for Gary Marx and Carrie Severino – your fellow "benchmemo" writers on the Halligan nomination – and have received no response to them to my three prior e-mails, I would appreciate if you would forward them this fourth e-mail, with my similar invitation that they call me when they wish further info on the status of her confirmation.
