Assembly Rule IV "Committees" reads as follows at §9:

- (6) the Assembly Committee on Local Governments;
- (7) the Assembly Rules Committee;
- (8) the Assembly Ways and Means Committee;
- (9) the Assembly Committee on Ethics and Guidance.

Additionally, inasmuch as the <u>FY2024-25 legislative budget</u> (at p. 2) states "The Assembly conducts its legislative business through the operation of 37 standing committees", please furnish records as to what is the accurate number of Assembly standing committees.
