Joint Legislative Commissions of Legislative Law Articles 5, 5-A, and 5-B

TO: Senate Records Access Officer/Secretary of the Senate Alejandra Paulino, Esq. Assembly Records Access Officer Fern Whyland

<u>Legislative Law Article 5 (§80)</u> establishes the Legislative Ethics Commission, <u>Legislative Law Article 5-A (§§82-83)</u> lists 14 legislative commissions, and <u>Legislative Law Article 5-B (§§86-88)</u> lists a further legislative commission – the Administrative Regulations Review Commission.

The <u>Senate's webpage for "Senators and Committees"</u> identifies only two of these "Legislative Commissions":

- (1) the <u>Legislative Commission on Administrative Regulations Review</u>, chaired by Senator Felder, with two additional Senate members: Ashby and Skoufis;
- (2) the <u>Legislative Commission on Rural Resources</u>, chaired by Senator May, with four additional Senate members: Helming, Gallivan, Hinchey, and Webb (Legislative Law §83-I);

The <u>Assembly's webpage for "Committees & More"</u> identifies the following nine "Legislative Commissions":

- (1) the <u>Legislative Commission on Administrative Regulations Review</u>, chaired by Assemblyman Stern, with one additional member: Assemblyman Goodell.
- (2) the <u>Legislative Commission on Government Administration</u>, chaired by Assemblyman Carroll, with two additional members: Assemblymen Brabenec and DiPietro;
- (3) the <u>Legislative Commission on Rural Resources</u>, with no indicated chair and three members: Assemblymen Jones and Palmesano and Assemblywoman Woerner;
- (4) the <u>Legislative Commission on Solid Waste Management</u>, chaired by Assemblywoman Hyndman, with two additional members: Assemblymen Gallahan and Tannousis;
- (5) the <u>Legislative Commission on Toxic Substances and Hazardous Wastes</u>, with no chair, but two members: Assemblymen Morinello and Tannousis;
- (6) the <u>Legislative Commission on Future of the Long Island Power Authority</u>, co-chaired by Assemblyman Thiele and Senator Thomas, and five additional members: Assemblyman Anderson and Smith, Assemblywoman Solages, and Senators Gaughran and Sanders;

- (7) the <u>Legislative Commission on Legislative Ethics</u>, chaired by Assemblywoman Simon, with no additional members;
- (8) the <u>Legislative Commission on Skills Development and Career Education</u>, chaired by Assemblyman Conrad, with two additional members: Assemblymen Blankenbush and Durso; and
- (9) the <u>Legislative Commission on State-Local Relations</u>, chaired by Assemblyman Epstein, with no additional members.

It also lists, under the title "Task Forces and Other Entities", the <u>Legislative Task Force on Demographic Research and Reapportionment</u>, chaired by Assemblyman Zebrowski, with one additional member: Assemblyman Palmesano – (Legislative Law §83-M).

Pursuant to <u>Senate Rule XIV ["Freedom of Information"]</u> and <u>Assembly Rules VIII ["Public Access to Records"]</u>, this is to request records reflecting the appointment of the members and chairs of the 14 <u>Legislative Law Article 5-A commissions</u>, the <u>Legislative Law Article 5-B</u> Administrative Regulations Review Commission, and the <u>Legislative Law Article 5 (§80)</u> Legislative Ethics Commission, consistent with those statutory provisions.
