MESSAGE:

As discussed, enclosed is the Article 78 Petition, together with the Notice of Petition and Notice of Right to Seek Intervention representing, together with Exhibit "A" referred to at ¶ "SIXTH" of the Petition. Also enclosed is a brochure about CJA. A full set of papers, including our Order to Show Cause for an injunction and default judgment against the Commission, set down for oral argument on Tuesday, May 23rd before Justice Herman Cahn, will be express mailed tonight. At your suggestion, we will direct the papers to Jack Newfield's attention since you indicated you will be out of the office until the middle of next week.

We believe our case to be most significant challenge ever to the Commission on Judicial Conduct and hope that the Post will give it the coverage it deserves. Indeed, the Post has been most critical of the Commission, most recently in its March 7th editorial, "Who Judges the Judges?", a copy of which is enclosed for your convenience.
