## **RESTRAINING "LIARS IN THE COURTROOM" AND ON THE PUBLIC PAYROLL**

*On June 17th, The New York Law Journal published a Letter to the Editor from a former Assistant State Attorney General, whose opening sentence read "Attorney General Dennis Vacco's worst enemy would not suggest that he tolerates unprofessional or irresponsible conduct by his assistants after the fact". Yet, more than three weeks earlier, the Center for Judicial Accountability, Inc. (CJA) , a non-partisan, non-profit citizens' organization, submitted a proposed Perspective Column to the Law Journal, detailing the Attorney General's knowledge of, and complicity in, his staff's litigation misconduct -- before, during, and after the fact. The Law Journal refused to print it and refused to explain why. Because of the transcending public importance of that proposed Perspective Column, CJA has paid \$3,077.22 so that you can read it. It appears on page 4.*
