ORDER

This complaint in this matter consists of generally conclusory allegations concerning the complained of district judge in handling of complainant's Northern District of Florida case, number 89-30351. Complaints such as this one that are directly related to the merits of a judicial decision are not reviewable under 28 U.S.C. § 372(c). In that the complaint contains no allegations against the complained of district judge that could be considered as "conduct prejudicial to the effective and expeditious administration of the business of the courts" within the meaning of 28 U.S.C. 372(c)(1), this complaint is DISMISSED.
