## TO: 2023 Commission on Legislative, Judicial & Executive Compensation

My October 12<sup>th</sup> letter to the Commission, entitled "'History', Your Website -- & Prepping for Tomorrow's Hearing", alerted you that contrary to Chair Fahey's assertions about the Commission's website, it did NOT post "all the prior commission reports, all their hearings, and all their meetings. Most importantly,

- (1) there is no 2011 side panel. Consequently, no 'history' of the 2011 Commission on Judicial Compensation is 'accessible': not its August 29, 2011 report, not its single hearing, not its meetings, and not submissions made to it;
- (2) the 2018 side panel brings up ONLY a pdf of the December 10, 2018 report of the Committee on Legislative and Executive Compensation. Consequently, no 'history' is 'accessible' concerning that report, as none of the hearings, meetings, and submissions to the committee are posted;
- (3) the 2019/20 side panel does NOT include the <u>December 26, 2019 report</u> of the Commission on Legislative, Judicial and Executive Compensation...

Please confirm that you will be retrieving the missing webpages of the 2011 commission and 2018 committee, whose websites were, respectively, <a href="https://www.judicialcompensation.ny.gov">www.judicialcompensation.ny.gov</a> and <a href="https://www.judicialcompensation.ny.gov">nyscompensation.ny.gov</a> — and putting them on your website. fn2"

I have NOT received the requested confirmation. The ONLY change to the Commission's website has been the addition of the December 26, 2019 report to the <a href="2019/20 side panel">2019/20 side panel</a>. Consequently, this is to request, pursuant to FOIL (Public Officers Law, Article VI), publicly-available records reflecting why the

Commission has NOT confirmed that it is "retrieving the missing webpages for the 2011 commission and the 2018 committee" – and the status of its retrieval efforts, if any.
