

<u>Update</u>: The Assembly has not sent our M/C Pay Commission Act bill to the Governor yet. This is not at all unusual. The end of the legislative session produced over 500 pieces of passed legislation.

Just over 200 bills have been sent to the Governor so far. Upon receipt in the Governor's Office, each bill is assigned to an Assistant Counsel to the Governor. Next, it is reviewed against relevant statutes and comments of support (e.g. our memo, your letters) or objection that have been received by the Governor's Office. These are addressed in the Counsel's memorandum to the Governor.

The Governor has 10 days (excluding Sundays) to act, from the date of receipt of the bill in the Governor's Office. He can veto the bill, sign it into law, or allow it to become law by doing nothing.
