Following up our phone conversation a short time ago, the New York Law Journal's IMMEDIATE correction of Joel's item should reflect that the Commission's website (which I believe only went live yesterday) is <http://nyscommissiononcompensation.org> -- and that it indicates a meeting for tomorrow, not a "public hearing".

Moreover, pursuant to statute -- and the website posts the statute -- the Commission's proceedings are governed by "articles 6, 6-A and 7 of the public officers law". This means that the meeting should be live-streamed/videoed. Will it be? That's for you to investigate & report -- as likewise my attached October 30, 2015 FOIL/records request which appears to have triggered sudden activity -- or at least caused it to surface.

SCARY HALLOWEEN ALERT:
NYLJ reports – “Hearing Set on Pay Increases for Judges, Lawmakers”

The attached item from the New York Law Journal's website, <http://www.newyorklawjournal.com/home/id=1202741247876/Hearing-Set-on-Pay-Increases-for-Judges-Lawmakers?mcode=1202615069279&curindex=1>, posted in the early morning hours today, Saturday, October 31st, for publication in its Monday, November 2nd paper edition is the first notice of a supposed “public hearing” to be held by the Commission on Legislative, Judicial and Executive Compensation, scheduled for 9 a.m. on Tuesday, November 3rd.

Assuming that a member of the public would see the Law Journal item, is there no sign-up to testify? Is there no registration? Just a walk-in? And how has this important Commission – whose recommendations will cost taxpayers billions of dollars – been operating until now? Does it have an office, staff, phone number, e-mail address, website?

According to the Law Journal, the Governor appointed three of the Commission's members and “Senate Republicans” selected “James Lack, a former Court of Claims judge and former state senator”. When did they do that? Was no press release issued?

These and other questions were asked yesterday morning, October 30th, by a FOIL request that our non-partisan, non-profit citizens' organization, Center for Judicial Accountability, Inc. (CJA), sent for records pertaining to the Commission's membership, when the appointments were made, and how the Commission has been operating. It is attached so that New York's watchdog press can secure answers from the Commission – and from New York's highest public officers who are its appointing authorities: the Governor, the Temporary Senate President, the Assembly Speaker, and the Chief Judge.

I am available to answer questions – and to be interviewed, including as to my phone inquiries to the offices of these four appointing authorities at the end of June that prompted the only public announcement of any Commission appointments – the rushed press release of the Office of Court Administration, late in the day on June 30, 2015, thereupon reported by the July 1, 2015 Law Journal, of the Chief Judge's appointment of Sheila Birnbaum and Barry Cozier.

Meantime, you can access the proof of the brazen fraud committed by the predecessor 2011 Commission on Judicial Compensation – and the collusion therein of the same constitutional officers of the legislative, judicial, and executive branches as believe themselves entitled to pay raises – as it is all posted on CJA's website,

www.judgewatch.org. Indeed, the particulars are meticulously laid out in three hair-raising lawsuits, accessible from the prominent homepage link: “What's Taking You So Long, Preet?: CJA's Three Litigations whose Records are Perfect ‘Paper Trails’ for Indicting New York's Highest Public Officers for Corruption”.

For your convenience, here are links to my prior testimony at public hearings on the subject of the collusion of the three government branches with respect to the judicial pay raises and the fraud, statutory violations, and unconstitutionality of the 2011 Commission on Judicial Compensation– the cost of which, to date, in financial terms alone, is in the range of \$150 million:
