This is to alert you to GOOD NEWS. You can EASILY defeat Assemblyman Dan Stec and Assemblyman Mark Walczyk – and without expenditure of money. All it requires is using the “bully-pulpit” of your candidacy to whistle-blow about the above-attached FULLY-DOCUMENTED public corruption/grand jury complaint against them and their five fellow St. Lawrence County state legislators that St. Lawrence County District Attorney state Pasqua has been “sitting on”. The complaint establishes, with EVIDENCE, that all seven must be indicted on EVIDENCE so *prima facie* and open-and-shut as to assure convictions.

North Country Now and NNY360 have known about the complaint for some time. Illustrative is the below September 16th e-mail to them, to which all seven legislative incumbents and D.A. Pasqua were cc'd so that they could be ready for press inquiries. Individually and collectively, if you stand up for honest, accountable government and make the complaint your campaign issue, you will win – easily. Demand that Assemblymen Stec and Walczyk respond to the complaint, that D.A. Pasqua explain why he has not presented it to a St. Lawrence County grand jury, and that the press do its part to investigate and report.

I am available to answer your questions – and invite you to call me so that I can furnish you with further specifics.

Needless to say, voters are entitled to know from you what salary you expect to be paid, if you were to be elected to the Legislature – and whether you will commit to ensuring: (1) public findings of fact and conclusions of law with respect to the complaint; (2) prosecution of all culpable public officers and their conspirators; and (3) “claw-backs” to recover the approximately half-a-billion dollars in fraudulent salary increases, already paid out. Please advise.

As North Country Now and NNY360 will doubtless be ramping up election reporting in the coming weeks – and interviewing you, including for purposes of candidate endorsements – I am cc'ing them.

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Subject: St. Lawrence County Elections 2020 -- Informing Voters with EVIDENCE: public corruption/grand jury complaint vs St. Lawrence County's 7 state legislators -- 6 running for re-election -- which St. Lawrence D.A. Pasqua is "sitting on"

St. Lawrence County's seven state legislators – six running for re-election, including Senate Deputy Minority Leader Griffo – are the subjects of a **fully-documented** public corruption/grand jury complaint, filed with St. Lawrence County District Attorney Pasqua, who has been “sitting on” it. The complaint involves the “force of law” commission/committee scheme that gave all eight of them pay raises – and a legislature not operating at a remotely constitutional level.

The June 22, 2020 complaint, by the Center for Judicial Accountability, Inc. (CJA), is above-attached – and below are the e-mails transmitting it and the above-attached July 31, 2020 FOIL request to D.A. Paqua. CJA's substantiating evidentiary webpage for the complaint is here: <http://www.jugewatch.org/web-pages/searching-nys/2020-legislative/grand-juries.htm>.

As stated by the complaint, St. Lawrence County voters are entitled to know that their state legislators cannot be re-elected because they must be indicted for larceny and other corruption on EVIDENCE so DISPOSITIVE as to assure convictions. So, too, retiring state Senator Little, who will be pocketing a salary-based pension that is also larcenous.

To facilitate your inquiries of the complained-against state legislators and D.A. Pasqua, I am cc'ing them on this e-mail. What, if anything, do they deny or dispute. Let them start where the complaint starts: my July 16, 2019 e-mail to Senate Deputy Minority Leader Griffo and the Legislature's 14 other stipend-receiving leaders requesting that they forward the e-mail to the 198 other state legislators, with its attached July 15, 2019 written NOTICE and substantiating analysis establishing that the December 10, 2018 Report of the Committee on Legislative and Executive Compensation – raising their legislative salaries from \$79,500 to \$110,000 – is “a fraud on the People of the State of New York – and a larceny of their tax dollars’, violating a succession of penal laws, and that their duty was to void it, to return the pay-raise monies they had already received, and to initiate criminal prosecutions of the Committee's four members and
