Judicial Complaint Pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 372(c)

ORDER

This complaint was filed with the Clerk of the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit on January 25, 1995. Sassower complains that Chief United States Circuit Judge Gerald Bard Tjoflat misused his administrative powers and authority as Chief Judge in matters brought by the complainant. Sassower also makes unsupported, improper allegations against Chief Judge Tjoflat and the court. Given that this complaint is directly related to the merits of one or more judicial decisions or procedural rulings, it is not reviewable under Section 372(c)(3)(A)(ii). Section 372(c) is not an alternative or additional judicial review provision for the subject matter of this complaint.

Accordingly, this complaint is DISMISSED.
