Dear Mr. Stern,

1. I received the letter of acknowledgment from your office dated February 24, 1994, on March 1, 1994. The postmark indicated a mailing on that date. Otherwise stated, the delay was not of your doing.

2a. Enclosed find my First Set, Notice to Admit, addressed to the above-mentioned, with respect to the incarceration of DENNIS F. VILELLA ["Vilella"] for crimes never committed by anyone as conclusively shown by the hospital exhibits.

b. To incarcerate Vilella for almost six (6) years for crimes never committed by anyone in an attempt to extort my silence on unrelated matters, is unquestionably judicial misconduct unequalled in the Commission's twenty (20) year history.

c. That an quintessential culprit to this depraved adventure is the senior judicial officer of your Commission elevates this scandal to vertiginous heights, which I intend to capitalize on, if I must.

d. My immediate goal, however, is to have "Vilella, The Hostage" released, and I suggest it be given separate, immediate, and prompt attention, since patience is not a quality that can be expected under the circumstances.
