In the 2019 legislative session, two identical bills were introduced in the Senate and Assembly, "to amend the county law, in relation to the full-time status of the district attorney of Hamilton county". These bills were S.4632, introduced by Senator James Tedisco on March 18, 2019 – and referred to the Senate Committee on Local Government, and A.7215, introduced by Assemblyman Robert Smullen on April 12, 2019 – and referred to the Assembly Committee on Local Governments. At the bottom right of each one-page bill appears the same identifier: "LBD09006-01-9". An identical sponsor's memorandum accompanied each bill : Senate webpage and Assembly webpage.

Pursuant to Senate Rule XIV ("Freedom of Information"), Assembly Rule VIII ("Public Access to Records"), and Public Officers Law Article VI ("Freedom of Information Law" [FOIL]), this is to request records reflecting:

- (1) what is signified by the numbering sequence "9006-01-9";
- (2) the Legislative Bill Drafting Commission's role in drafting and/or advising as to these two bills and their accompanying sponsor's memos, as per Legislative Law §25, "Duties of the commission", which reads in pertinent part:

"The commission shall:

1. Draft or aid in drafting or examine legislative bills and resolutions and amendments thereto, upon request of a member or committee of either house of the legislature;
