	2023-24 budget, transmitted by Temporary Senate President Stewart-Cousins and

Assembly Speaker Heastie to Governor Hochul under a December 1, 2022 coverletter, violates <u>Article VII</u>, <u>§1 of the New York State Constitution</u>, as it is NOT "[i]temized estimates of the financial needs of the legislature, certified by the presiding officer of each house". <u>Governor Hochul's Legislative/Judiciary</u> <u>Appropriation Bill #S.4001/A.3001</u>, expanding upon it by 38 pages of "legislative reappropriations", is even more unconstitutional and larcenous.

The particulars are set forth by my written testimony for the Legislature's February 15, 2023 budget hearing on "Local Government Officials/General Government", which presented 38 questions for Temporary Senate President Stewart-Cousins and Assembly Speaker Heastie to answer – the 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup>

of which inquired, based on the observation that Article VII, §1 limits their roles to certifying the Legislature's "itemized estimates of financial needs", whether your three Committees are among the "appropriate committees" responsible for formulating or approving the "itemized estimates" for them to certify. Are they?

In the event my testimony was not distributed to you by Senate Finance Committee Chair Krueger and Assembly Ways and Means Committee Chair Weinstein, to whom, by the below e-mail, I timely sent it on February 15<sup>th</sup>, in compliance with their announced rules, <u>here</u> and <u>here</u>, it is above attached and <u>here</u> <u>linked</u>.

Will your Committees collectively and individually call upon Temporary Senate President Stewart-Cousins and Assembly Speaker Heastie to answer the 38 questions? If not, why not – and what are your own answers, collectively and individually, to these 38 questions.

Based on the analysis furnished by the questions, do you agree that Governor Hochul's duty with respect to her upcoming "30-day amendments" is:

- to amend Legislative/Judiciary Appropriation Bill #S.4001/A.3001 by REMOVING the 38 pages of "legislative reappropriations" that were inserted into the back of her bill in an out-of-sequence, mistitled §4 as the Legislature's FY2023-24 budget contained NO "legislative reappropriations" (testimony, questions ##30-35);
- to amend Legislative/Judiciary Appropriation Bill #S.4001/A.3001 by REMOVING the entirety of §1 of legislative appropriations, in other words, the Legislature's budget – because it was NOT furnished to her as "[i]temized estimates of the financial needs of the legislature, certified by the presiding officer of each house", as Article VII, §1 requires (testimony, questions ##1-5);
- to amend State Operations Appropriation Bill #S.4000/A.3000 to ADD the Independent Redistricting Commission and such appropriations for it as are, in fact, necessary – because the appropriations for it in the Legislature's FY2023-24 budget do NOT belong in the Legislature's budget and are grossly inflated and larcenous, quite apart from the "reappropriations" for the Independent Redistricting Commission that were popped into her Legislative/Judiciary Appropriation Bill S.4001/A.3001 (testimony, questions ##16-19).

And do you agree that Governor Hochul's "30-day amendments" are an opportunity for her to <u>belatedly</u> meet her constitutional duty to furnish the Legislature with "such recommendations as the governor may deem proper" with respect to the legislative and judiciary budgets (Article VII, \$1) – as she made NONE on February 1, 2023 in submitting her Legislative/Judiciary Appropriation Bill #S.4001/A.3001 to the Legislature (testimony, question #36).

<u>Time being of the essence, please advise as immediately as possible</u> – and confirm that you will take action to ensure that <u>my February 15<sup>th</sup> written testimony</u> is placed on the agendas of your next Committee meetings for discussion and vote as to your duties with respect thereto – and, likewise, <u>my written testimony incorporated therein and timely submitted for the Legislature's February 7<sup>th</sup> "Public Protection" budget hearing.</u>

I would be pleased to make a presentation at such Committee meetings, answering all your questions, including under oath – and <u>Senate Rule VII,  $\S2(d)$  expressly provides for same.</u>
