Subject: Gov. Cuomo's potential crimes that you are investigating, sua sponte--& the status of CJA's June 10, 2020 FULLY-DOCUMENTED grand jury/public corruption complaint of actual crimes involving him, in which Nassau state legislators are colluding beneficiaries

TO: Acting Nassau County District Attorney Joyce Smith

This follows the voice mail message I left yesterday at about 1:25 pm on the Nassau County District Attorney tip line (516-571-7755, option #6: corruption by a public official) – prompted by media reports of your [August 4th press statement](#) that, based on Attorney General James' “deeply disturbing” [report](#) of Governor Cuomo's purported “sexual harassment”, you had requested her “records related to any incidents that occurred in Nassau County” so that you can “thoroughly and expeditiously investigate any potential crimes.”

This request was apparently *sua sponte* on your part.

My voice mail inquired as to whether you had not also found “deeply disturbing” the June 10, 2020 grand jury/public corruption complaint I had filed with former Nassau County District Attorney Madeline Singas and with the chief of her Public Corruption Bureau, Christine Maloney – to which I had received no response – and requested, if you were unaware of the complaint, that it be immediately furnished to you. I received no call back.

Below are my three e-mails to D.A. Singas – on July 27, 2020, June 11, 2020, and June 10, 2020 – transmitting to her the above-attached June 10, 2020 grand jury/public corruption complaint, furnishing *prima facie*, open-and-shut, EVIDENCE as to a slew of ACTUAL crimes committed by Nassau County state legislators, involving, *inter alia*, Governor Cuomo and Attorney General James, pertaining to pay raises of which they and she are beneficiaries, and the budgets of New York State and Nassau County. To this FULLY-DOCUMENTED complaint, which I had also signed under penalties of Penal Law §175.30 and §210.45, I have received no response.

Before D.A. Singas left to take her seat as a New York Court of Appeals associate judge, following her June 8, 2021 Senate confirmation, did she not alert you to it? And did your Public Corruption Bureau not thereafter bring it to your attention as a complaint still outstanding – and review with you your financial and other conflicts of interest? Please advise.

Additionally, if you are not recusing yourself for conflicts of interest and activating appropriate protocols for appointment of a special prosecutor, please confirm that you will be scheduling me to testify before a Nassau County grand jury in support of my June 10, 2020 grand jury/public corruption complaint, so that it can perform its function under Article I, §6 of the New York State Constitution and Criminal Procedure Law Article 190.

Suffice to say that any potential crime by Governor Cuomo arising from his so-called “sexual harassment” of women with whom he flirted – as to which you had no filed complaint – does not “hold a candle” to the ACTUAL crimes he has committed, in tandem with Nassau County state legislators, pertaining to fraudulent pay raises and the budgets of Nassau County and New York State, evidentiarily-established by the June 10, 2020 grand jury/public corruption complaint.

By the way, am I correct in assuming, based on the Attorney General's August 3rd report, that Governor Cuomo's potential Nassau County "sexual harassment" crimes that you have *sua sponte* chosen to investigate, would, at most, be simple misdemeanors, not requiring grand jury indictment?

I have received no acknowledgment or other response to my June 10, 2020 public corruption/grand jury complaint against Nassau County state legislators, which I sent you by the below e-mail, with a direct link to the substantiating evidentiary webpage: <http://www.judgewatch.org/web-pages/searching-nys/2020-legislative/grand-juries.htm>. Likewise, I have received none from your Public Corruption Bureau to whose chief, Assistant District Attorney Christine Malone, I also sent the complaint, following her call back, on June 11th, to a voice mail message I had left with the Bureau (516-571-2100).

As the complaint presents evidence so *prima facie* and open-and-shut as to leave no doubt that a grand jury would speedily indict – and a trial jury speedily convict – the complained-against Nassau County state legislators and their accomplices, this nonfeasance raises reasonable questions as to how you and your Public Corruption Bureau perform with respect to *other* public corruption complaints filed by *other* members of the public. To help answer these questions, I have today filed a FOIL/information request with your office. It is attached.
