Van Houten, paid by Tompkins County taxpayers? Consistent with your admirable description of yourself on your website: "a nonprofit digital news site with a mission to improve civic and political understanding in Ithaca and Tompkins County by publishing and sustaining in-depth, educational, rigorous, timely and ethical journalism", will you investigate the answers to these two straight-forward salary questions affecting the pocket-book of Tompkins County taxpayers and the integrity of their county and state government?

Such investigative journalism is EASY, as the <u>open-and-shut</u>, <u>prima facie EVIDENCE</u> proving the larceny and fraud that has taken place is furnished by the above-attached June 15, 2020 public corruption/grand jury complaint that now-re-elected Tompkins County D.A. Van Houten has been "sitting on" -- with the knowledge of Tompkins County's four state legislative incumbents – who are the subjects of the complaint -- the candidates who ran to replace them, and such Tompkins County "local journalism" as The Ithaca Journal, Ithaca Times, and Cornell Daily Sun [see, here, and here</

Below are my June 15th and July 28th e-mails to D.A.
