I am director and co-founder of the New York-based national, non-partisan, non-profit citizens' organization, Center for Judicial Accountability, Inc. (CJA) – and deeply concerned that President Biden's four nominees for U.S. Attorney for New York will politicize their offices by NOT prosecuting public corruption involving New York's mostly Democratic public officers.

On March 23rd and April 27th, I communicated this concern by written messages to the Democratic Biden White House – without response. On July 26th, the Biden White House announced its first set of eight U.S. Attorney nominations – among them for New York's western district. To this, I responded by reaching out to Republican Senate Judiciary Committee Member Josh Hawley, including by the above-attached August 4th letter. In the absence of any response – and in the wake of the Biden White House's second set of eight U.S. Attorney nominations, announced on August 10th with three for New York's other districts: southern, eastern, and northern -- I reached out to other members of the Senate Judiciary Committee's Republican minority – and then to the Senate Judiciary Committee's Democratic majority office, to its Republican minority office and to Democratic minority members. My chain of e-mails reciting what has been happening – culminating in my September 3rd e-mail, to which I have received NO response – is below.

In short, the Democratic Senate Judiciary Committee majority office does NOT answer its phones, return voice messages, or respond to requests for info and documents pertaining to President Biden's 4 U.S. Attorney nominees for New York. The Republican Senate Judiciary Committee minority office and members are only marginally better –

notwithstanding the HUGE opportunity that my August 4th letter furnished them to raise essential questions about White House vetting, to topple – by the answers -- NY's mostly-Democratic highest state officers in its three government branches, to demonstrate a modicum of fealty to former President Trump, and to showcase what has been concealed, TOTALLY, by New York's "fake news"/corruption-abetting, election-rigging press.

This follows my below August 18th e-mail, with the above-attached August 4th letter to Senator Hawley – to which I received no response from anyone except counsel at the Committee's Republican minority office, Gabrielle Kenny, who called me that same day, August 18th, and, after a 20-minute phone conversation, made a phone appointment for August 20th, when we spoke for an hour, discussing the <u>serious and substantial conflicts of interest about which</u>
