At the suggestion of Meg Gourley, assistant to Public Editor Margaret Sullivan, in response to our June 28th misconduct complaint against Thomas Kaplan for his knowingly misleading and materially incomplete article, "As Minority Officials Are Caught Up in Scandals, Some See a Conspiracy", which <u>The Times</u> prominently published, above-the-fold, on the front-page of that day's metro section, below is our proposed letter to the editor.

Below, too, is the June 28th misconduct complaint against Mr. Kaplan and Ms. Gourley's July 3rd e-mail, suggesting and offering to facilitate a letter to the editor. These are, however, more intelligible from our

PROPOSED LETTER TO THE EDITOR IN RESOLUTION OF JUNE 28, 2013 COMPLAINT TO PUBLIC EDITOR

Are black and Hispanic legislators being selectively and invidiously investigated and prosecuted by the two U.S. Attorneys covering New York City? That is the important issue recognized by your prominently published metro article "As Minority Officials Are Caught Up in Scandals, Some See a Conspiracy" (6/28/13), but not meaningfully examined.

You identify that State Senator James Sanders "decided to address the issue head on" by his forum "Attack on Black Leaders: Corruption or Conspiracy?" However, you omit the documentary evidence of conspiracy presented at the forum, Senator Sanders' response to it, and that both were highlighted by a letter to all Senate and Assembly members requesting legislative follow-up, including by the 48-member Black, Puerto Rican, Hispanic and Asian Legislative Caucus, whose existence you also omit. Most egregiously, you omit the simple fact that it is easy to verify whether the U.S. Attorneys are "colorblind" in their investigations and prosecutions: all that is necessary is comparison of their handling of corruption complaints against black public officers with those against white. This is what I stated at Senator Sanders' forum and by my letter to the legislators, furnishing a fully-documented corruption complaint against New York's highest public officers — all of whom are white. Shouldn't you be examining and reporting on how our U.S. Attorneys handle complaints against top white public officers and other readily-verifiable evidence, instead of repeating their self-serving disclaimers of bias, as you do?

By this e-mail to Mr. Kaplan – and to the other <u>Times</u> recipients to whom our June 15th e-mail was contemporaneously sent – and to <u>Times</u> Public Editor Margaret Sullivan, to whom it is now being sent – I ask that Mr. Kaplan identify his response to our June 15th e-mail and to the voice mail message I left for him, on June 20th, on his cell #, 917-656-7870.

What would your response have been?

And do you think – based on the below June 15th e-mail and our above attached May 22nd letter to ALL Senators and Assembly Members and our May 13th letter/complaint to U.S. Attorney Lynch accompanying it– that Mr. Kaplan's story is appropriate, honest journalism, informing readers of what they need to know in evaluating the important question as to whether minority legislators are being selectively and invidiously investigated and prosecuted? This includes with respect to Senator Sanders' May 10th forum, "Attack on Black Leaders: Corruption or Conspiracy?" to which Mr. Kaplan devotes significant space – and the further issue, *not even identified as such by Mr. Kaplan*, that the public release of Senator Peralta's name – and the names of six other minority elected officials –- secretly taped by former Senator Huntley, though accused of no crime, is also evidence of conspiracy – as investigation of the underlying facts would establish.
